You show that you are a letter from Christ, the result of our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.**

**For what is our hope, our joy, or the crown in which we will glory in the presence of our Lord Jesus when he comes? Is it not you? Indeed, you are our glory and joy.**

The story is told of a young Jewish student who had studied for a long time under the wise guidance of a Rabbi named Moishe. After several years of study, the student became very troubled and agitated. And so Moishe visited with the student to discover what the problem was. The student looked at Moishe and said, "I have studied the lives of the heroes of the faith for several years now. And I have become very frustrated. I have discovered that regardless of how faithful or insightful or wise I try to become, there will always be an Abraham or a Moses or a Solomon who is even more faithful or more insightful or wiser than I am. How can I truly serve God and give myself to His Kingdom when there are so many other individuals who will always be greater than I am? How can I ever become an Abraham, or a Moses, or a Solomon?"

Moishe looked at his student for a moment and then answered, "My child, the greatest challenge that God has ever given to me was not for me to be an Abraham or a Moses. Rather, the greatest challenge that God has ever given to me was for me to be Moishe."

As you leave this place, I do not want to challenge you to become another Alan Lyke, or another Janice Duce, or another Tom King. I want to challenge you to become the person that God has created you to be. Go from this place and be the man of God or the woman of God that God planned you to be. Be the servant leader that God intended YOU to be.

Paul told us how to do this in Galatians chapter 2 when he wrote, "**I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me.**" May the Lord bless you, and may you become Christ incarnate to a lost and dying world.
